Introduction to 3-D Art.

## AIMS:

- 1. Students will be familiarized with the rituals and routines of the classroom.
- 2. Students will be introduced to paper sculpture.

GRADE LEVEL: 3-D art class, grades 10-12, meeting 3 times per week: for 1-40 minute period on Monday, and 2-80 minute periods held either on Tuesday/Thursday.

**MATERIALS**: Notebooks, Sketchbooks, sculpture paper, pencils, attendance material, Escher slides, computer and projector, index cards.

## DO NOW:

1. Students will complete *Delaney Cards*, or other attendance taking materials with special emphasis on parents' home and cell numbers.

## PROCEDURE:

- 1. Teacher will introduce the topic of paper sculpture.
  - When you think of 3-D art, what do you think of?
  - Can you think of materials we will use to create such pieces?
  - Have you ever created sculpture out of paper?
- 2. Teacher will show the Escher clip from the Moodle page.
- 3. There are some textual resources we are going to use for our paper sculpture projects. They are available on my web page.
- 3. Teacher will demonstrate how to access <a href="http://arts.professorklein.com">http://arts.professorklein.com</a> and the *Moodle portal*.
- 4. Teacher will demonstrate how to use the materials to put together the paper as a sculpture.
- 5. Students will begin the assignment: Students will put together a cube and another shape of their own choosing.

**HOMEWORK**: Students will read *Paper Sculpture*: 3D Art from *Paper or Card*. They will finish their cubes and shapes sculptures.
